Phrasal Verbs...

are made of a main verb
followed by particles, e.g.

figure out
come up with
steer clear of

The words combine to make a new meaning, often independent of the separate parts. Thus,

main verb	particle	new meaning
tell	apart	distinguish one thing from another
shut	up	stop talking
kick	out	expel

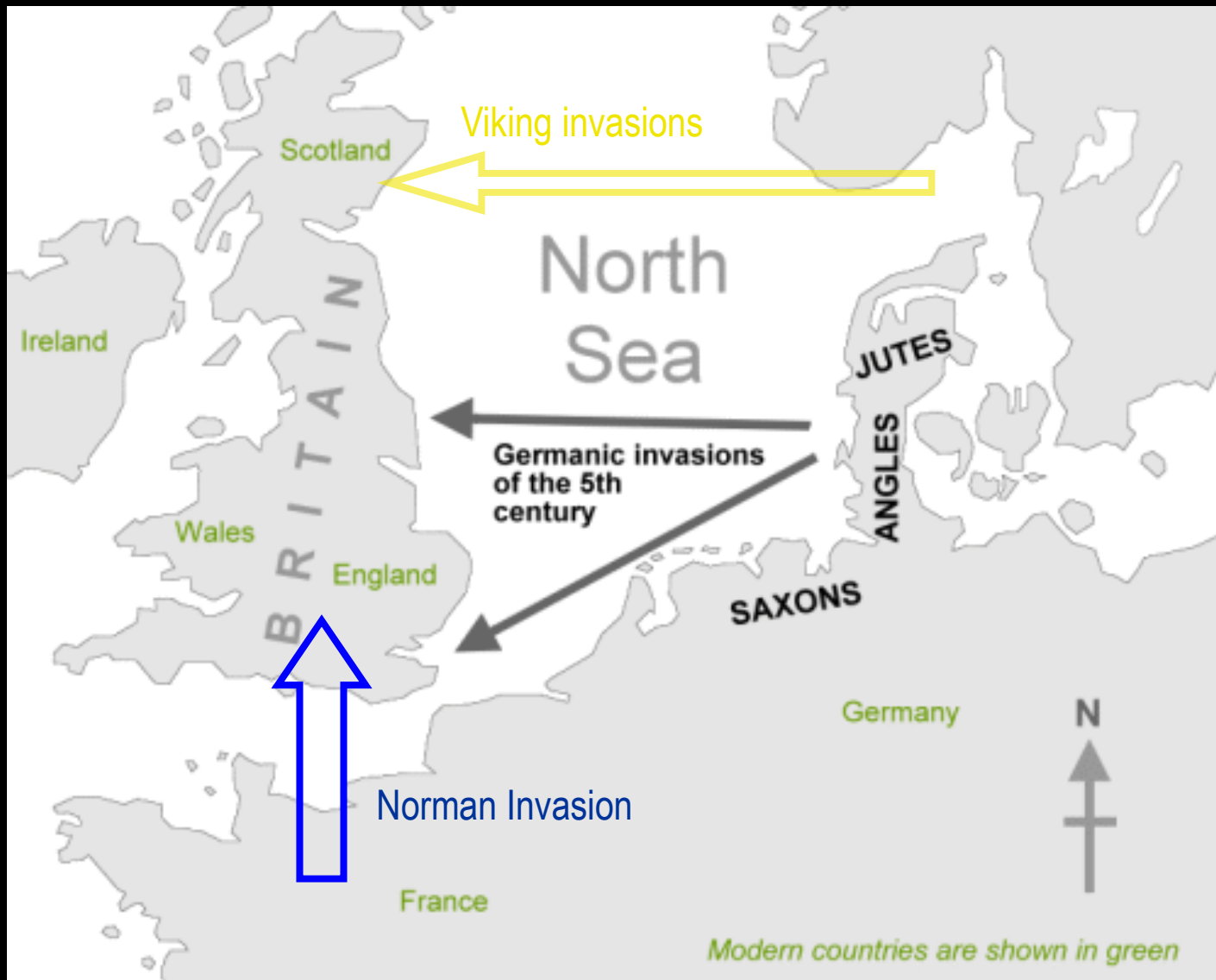

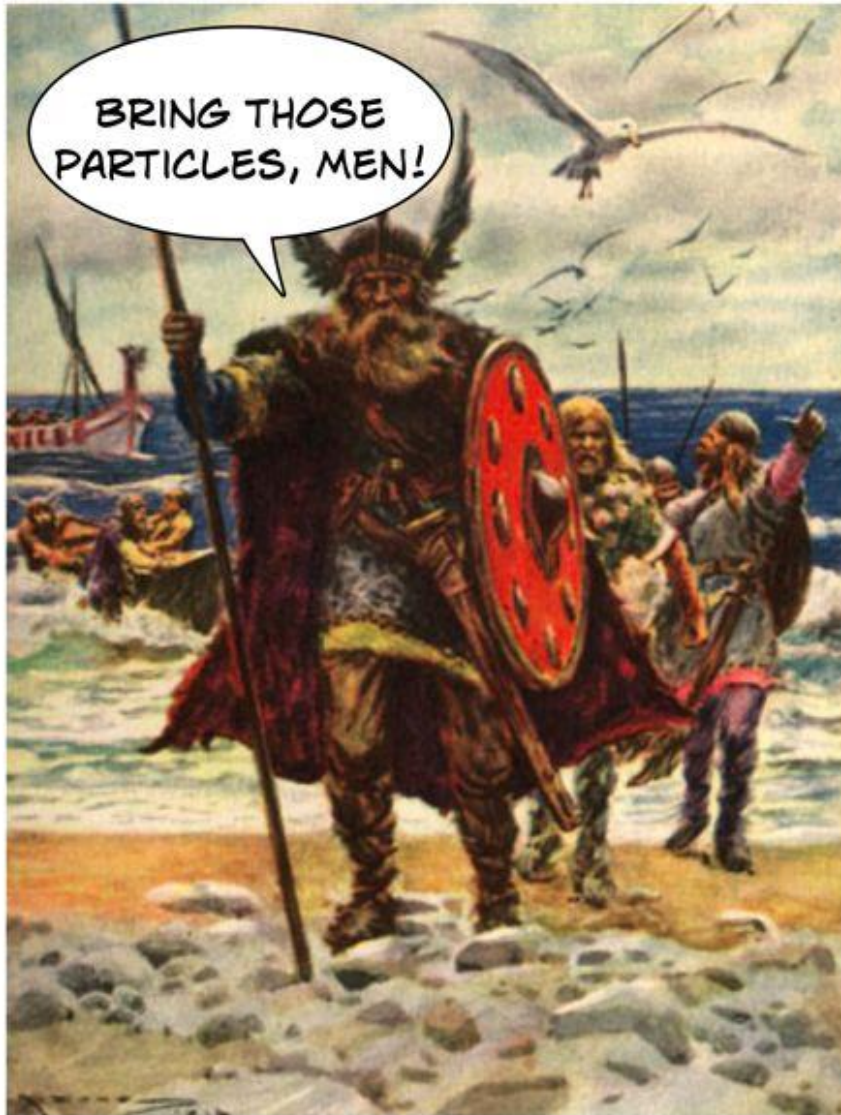

Teaching Party Verbs



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The Whole Thing

Get students to focus on seeing the whole thing: the verb and the particles together.

Think “learning”

Instead of “teaching,” allow students the chance to learn, by exploring how phrasal verbs are used.

Provide a huge variety of activities.

Beware Grammarocity*

An unrestrained zeal for applying--
and especially explaining--grammar
rules even when they are confusing
or inaccurate.

*This word doesn't officially exist--yet.

Repetition

We learn language through repetition. The English teacher's perpetual goal, then, is to expose learners to a huge amount of repeated language forms while keeping things fresh. The key, of course, is variety.
