- to suggest or think of an idea or plan

Let's come up with a destination for our holiday.

across

- to find accidentally

While cleaning, I came across a childhood photo.

by

- to get, acquire

We don't know how she came by that much money.

out with

- to utter; to produce

Apple has come out with a new version of iPhone.

along with

- to accompany

Can you come along with us to the movies tonight?

down with

- to become ill with (something)

She came down with the flu yesterday.
