

What's the difference?

STILL

- used to talk about something that hasn't finished – especially when it was expected to finish earlier
- used in questions, affirmative and negative sentences

He is still angry at his best friend.

Are you still smoking? I thought you had quit.

YET

- used to talk about something which is expected to happen
- used in questions and negative sentences

Have you written the report yet?

Jill hasn't finished her homework yet.

ALREADY

- used to talk about something that has happened, often earlier than expected
- usually used in affirmative sentences & questions

I already know what I will buy you for your birthday.

Has Tim already left the party?
