take a leaf out of someone's book

to follow someone's example; to behave as someone else would

I should take a leaf out of your book and start studying for exams earlier.



turn over a new leaf

to reform and begin again

She said she has turned over a new leaf; she is studying and attending her classes instead of goofing off.

autumn years

later years of someone's life

He spent his autumn years gardening and bird watching.

someone who is cherished above everyone

My niece is the apple of my eye.
I would do anything for her!
